GRSS at a Glance

- The Society was first known as the Geoscience Electronics Group, formed in 1962.
- It then became the Geoscience Electronics Society in January 1978.
- In 1980, the name of the Society was changed to the Geoscience and Remote Sensing Society (GRSS) to more accurately reflect the broad scope of its interests and activities.
- Currently, it totals 3500+ members across the world.

Reporting

- Two different and independent kinds of reporting are continuously needed from each Chapter Chair:
 - **Reporting to GRSS**
 - **Reporting to MGA Department (see next slide)**
- At the end of every year, GRSS asks for a report of the activities performed during that year.
- This report is important for GRSS to monitor its Chapters but also for the Chapters for being eligible to request a grant for the activities of the successive year.
- A template is sent for such purpose every year by the Chapters Committee Chair.
- Again, it is very important not to confuse between the annual report for GRSS and the L31 reports for IEEE MGA (see next slide) as they are not connected to each other, being parts of different monitoring processes.



MGA Department

- In order to maintain viability and to ensure that all Chapters are meeting the needs of their members, each Chapter is also required by the Member and Geographic Activities (MGA) Board to submit annual reports of the following:
 - Meeting Activity (Online L-31 Form)
 - New Officers and Officer Changes
 - Financial Reporting via NetSuite
- Remember that in case of non reporting or low reporting of meeting activities (less than 2 meetings/year for three successive years), the MGA can dissolve your Chapter.

Annual GRSS Grants

- Every year, GRSS launches a call for funding activities of its Chapters.
- The maximum grant amount is typically \$3000.
- The grant is subject to the submission of a proposal of activities and related budget for the considered year.
- The grant is not accessible for Chapters which did not submit a report of their activities of the previous year to the Chair of the Chapters Committee.
- Indicative dates of the call:
 - Start: mid-November of each year (20XX)
 - Deadline: mid-January of 20XX+1



Distinguished Lecturer Program

- The DL program aims at providing Chapters with access to a catalogue of Distinguished Lecturers, with no extra cost for the Chapters.
- After contacting a Distinguished Lecturer and agreement is reached on the details of the visit, the Chapter Chair needs to submit an application form to the DL Program Chair for approval.
- Support for a Distinguished Lecturer is up to \$1500 per domestic trip and to \$3000 for a trip between continents.

Special Initiatives

- GRSS regularly fires up special initiatives for tightening further the links between Chapters and their local contexts (members, centers, industries, administration, school...) as well as international realities (other Chapters, institutions, organizations...).
- The Chapters Committee Chair provides communications with all information revolving around such initiatives (e.g., ChapNet initiative) as soon as they are approved by the AdCom.



GRSS Technical Committees

- Activities of Technical Committees include networking, organization of thematic workshops, education of young professionals, special sessions at IGARSS.
- Current TCs are:
 - Earth Science Informatics
 - Frequency Allocations in Remote Sensing
 - Instrumentation and Future Technologies
 - Image Analysis and Data Fusion
 - Geoscience Spaceborne Imaging Spectroscopy
 - Modeling in Remote Sensing
 - Standards for Earth Observation

Best Chapter Award

- When sending its annual report to GRSS, a Chapter can ask to run for the Best Chapter Award of the year, just by ticking a dedicated box in the report template.
- The reports of the Award candidates are evaluated by a Selection Committee composed of the Chapters Committee Chair and the Special Awards Chair on the basis of the following criteria: 1) technical seminars, 2) other technical activities, 3) education/outreach, 4) professional development, 5) involvement with GRSS/IGARSS, 6) membership development, 7) fundraising, 8) membership diversity, and 9) web presence.
- On the basis of the recommendations from the Selection Committee, the AdCom in its March meeting decides the winner.
- The Award consists of a check of \$1500 and a certificate. It is conferred during the Chapter Chairs Dinner organized during IGARSS.
